SUBJECT: INSTALLATION OF AUTOMATED EMERGENCY HIGH WATER SIGNAGE

DESCRIPTION: Discussion and possible recommendation regarding the installation of automated flood warning signs on flood prone streets adjacent to Jones Road.

BACKGROUND: During annual City emergency preparation discussions both Police and Public Works staff identified flood safety and preparedness as an emergency priority. The potential for dangerous flash flooding remains a threat to the low water crossings in the neighborhoods adjacent to Jones Rd.

A key element of safety during flooding episodes, is reaction time. Currently, on-duty police officers serve as the initial detectors of dangerously high-water levels. Relying on the availability and awareness of officers could result in delayed notifications and tragedy. Installing automated flood sensors in affected areas would provide a reliable, immediate notification that road conditions are dangerous. Rather than installing floodgates, flashing warning signs would serve as emergency notification that drivers should not cross a particular section of road. The signs would be activated and deactivated based on water levels on the roadway. Signage can be acquired for under \$30,000.

Recommendation: Discuss and determine whether or not the City should install automated flood warning signage at low-water crossings.

SUBJECT: UPDATE ON CITY SECURITY CAMERAS/LICENSE PLATE READERS

DESCRIPTION: Monthly Review of Security Camera/License Plate Readers Program

BACKGROUND:

Crime Control Prevention District funds were used to purchase ten (10) security camera/license plate readers that have been installed around the city to assist with the detection of criminal activity and apprehending offenders. The cameras record license plates and vehicle descriptions. Within seconds of a wanted vehicle passing any of the cameras, an alert is sent to police officers. Officers are then able to track the wanted vehicle as it passes through the city. Not only do the cameras help with real-time apprehension of wanted subjects, but police officers can also access the cameras' historical data to develop investigative leads for reported crimes. The police department anticipates that case clearance rates will dramatically increase, particularly for crimes involving vehicle burglaries and organized retail theft. The cameras became fully operational on 1/28/2022.
