Council Member Rosengarten made a motion to approve Agenda Items #5, 8 and 9 on consent, seconded by Council Member Johnson. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Council Member Reetz made a motion to table this agenda item until the April 20th City Council Meeting, seconded by Council Member Rosengarten. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Council Member Rosengarten made a motion to table this agenda item, seconded by Council Member Reetz.

Staff was directed to bring back additional information to Council regarding this item.

All voted in favor and the motion carried.

- 8. Consider and act on approving the Financial Policies FP 101 and FP 103 (Council Member Rosengarten/Administration). *Item Approved on Consent*.
- Consider and act on approving the Budget and Finance Committee Goals approved by the Budget and Finance Committee on March 25, 2021 (Council Member Rosengarten/Administration). *Item Approved on Consent.*
- 10. Consider and act on the Tankless Water Heater Rebate Program by (Council Member Rosengarten/Administration):
 - A. Creating a new ordinance in a new Chapter 42 to codify the comprehensive conservation rebates program to provide funding for water conservation and other sustainability programs.
 - B. Amending the program to allow for the additional category to include replacement of existing tankless water heaters.

Mayor Bruner and Sylvia Carrillo, the City Administrator, introduced this agenda item. There were comments and questions from Council Members.

Council Member Carmona made a motion to table 10-B and refer the conservation rebate program, including the tankless water heater replacement proposal, to the Budget and Finance Committee for feedback before bringing back to City Council. The motion was seconded by Council Member Reetz.

Mayor Pro tem Medicus made a motion to create a new ordinance in a new Chapter 42 to codify the comprehensive conservation rebates program to provide funding for water conservation and other sustainability programs, removing the fifth whereas clause referring to tankless water heater replacements. The motion was seconded by Council Member Johnson. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

Council Member Rosengarten made a motion to approve the Special Use Permit, with the conditions set forth in the Land Development Code Section 2.503(f), seconded by Council Member Reetz. All voted in favor and the motion carried.

City Council took a break at 7:22 and reconvened at 7:29 P.M.

- 13. Consider and act on a variance to Section 4.301 (d) of the Land Development Code to allow for additional parking for the business located at 6218 Brodie Lane operating as "The Barn" (Mayor Bruner/Administration).
 - Mayor Bruner introduced this agenda item.
 - Comments from Sylvia Carrillo, City Administrator
 - Comments and guestions from Council Member Carmona
 - Response from Barbara Boulware-Wells, City Attorney

Council Member Rosengarten made a motion to approve a variance to Section 4.301(d) of the Land Development Code to allow for additional parking for the business located at 6218 Brodie Lane operating as "The Barn" with the five findings, and the additional conditions recommended by the City Engineer, and amending the motion to include

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amending the restrictive covenant to remove or revise the section regarding parking on the property. The motion was seconded by Council Member Carmona, but the second did not agree to the amendment. Council Member Carmona withdrew his second.

Council Member Rosengarten made a motion to approve the variance to Section 4.301(d) of the Land Development Code to allow for additional parking for the business located at 6218 Brodie Lane operating as "the Barn" including the five findings, also including the City Engineer's recommendations (1-6), and amending the restrictive covenant removing C, the clause regarding parking restrictions. Council Member Reetz seconded the motion.

Comments from Anita Dunn, the applicant, responding to Council Member Carmona.

All voted in favor and the motion carried.

- 14. Consider and act on the development of a Small Business Assistance Program consisting of four (4) components (Mayor Bruner/Council Member Reetz):
 - A. Creation of a grant program similar in proportion to Phase 1 of the Austin Legacy Business Relief Grant, or 1.15% of the City's Annual Budget.
 - B. Create a Technical Assistance Program with a 3rd party to assist businesses to pursue existing grant opportunities at the state and federal level.
 - C. Discuss a program that provided utility bill assistance to business owners in Sunset Valley who seek economic relief.
 - D. Creation of a microbusiness site in City Hall to provide a resource for businesses to utilize.

Mayor Bruner introduced this item, with comments from the City Administrator on how to implement this program. There were questions and comments from Council Members.

Council Member Reetz made a motion to direct staff to pursue a 3rd party partner for the development of a monetary grant program and to create a technical assistance program for businesses in Sunset Valley, additionally create an application and approval and denial process to implement a utility bill assistance program, and create the process and implementation plan of a microbusiness site in City Hall once storage space is found for City files and equipment (Arts Commission). The motion was seconded by Mayor Pro tem Medicus. The motion carried by a 4-1 vote:

Council Member Johnson voted yes Mayor Pro tem Medicus voted yes Council Member Reetz voted yes Council Member Rosengarten voted yes Council Member Carmona voted no
